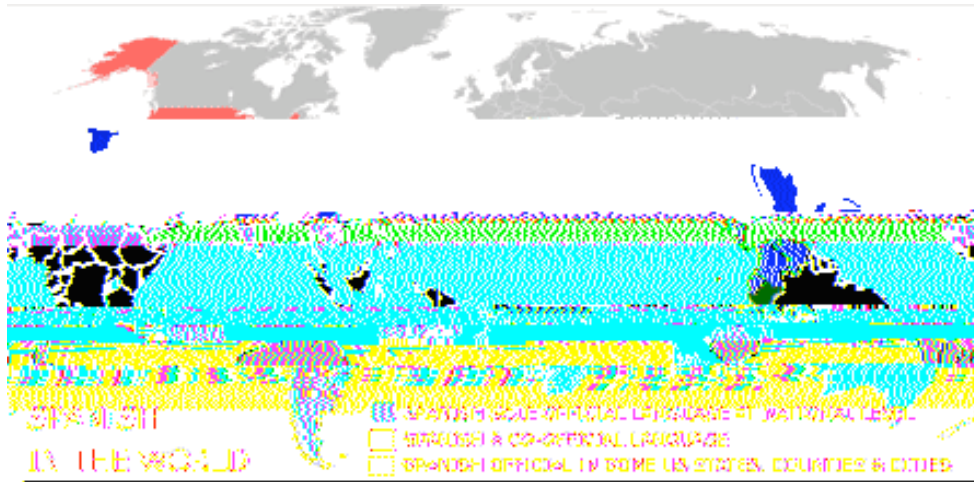


LSPA 0102: ELEMENTARY SPANISH II (ONLINE)

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I. Course Description

Spanish II is the **second** semester course in the Spanish sequence, designed to help students attain proficiency at an **elementary** level in comprehending, speaking, reading, and writing Spanish, through a task-oriented approach to language acquisition.

Prerequisite: one semester of college-level (LSPA 0101) or one year of high school Spanish.

II. Course Objectives

Upon **successful** completion of this course, the student will be able to perform proficiently, at a novice/elementary level, in the following language skills: listening, speaking, reading, and writing. It also aims at raising the student's awareness to the complexities of the cultures of the Spanish-speaking world, including those of communities in the United States.
